Per FMCA, if the member attends a convention, they must have a manufacturer-installed on-board generator. Portable generators will not be permitted.

The Board had a discussion Thursday morning of how to entice members to become Trail Bosses. A good sharing of ideas and clarification followed during our General Meeting. Currently the Trail Boss receives 4 free site nights, and the Assistant Trail Boss receives 3 free site nights. Bottom Line: The rally activities and food are the decision of the Trail Bosses.
A big "thank you" to Evelyn Teixeira for once again serving as our Nominating Committee Chairperson. We will vote on the slate of officers at our Bakersfield Rally in September. They will be sworn in at the Desert Hot Springs Rally in January 2019.
