#### FMCA NATIONAL DIRECTORS REPORT

Ed and I attended FMCA's 92<sup>nd</sup> Family Reunion & Motorhome Showcase in Madison, Wisconsin from July 29 through August 1, 2015. Highlights of the Governing Board Meeting were:

- Incumbents Charles Adcock-National President, Jon Walker-National Senior VP, and Percy Bell-National Treasurer all ran uncontested and were re-elected. Gaye Young won the race against John Ferrari 143 to 131 votes for the position of National Secretary
- California was recognized for having 24 of its 50 National Directors in attendance.
- New policies were adopted that require seven working days notice to FMCA when a chapter finds it necessary to appoint a Temporary Delegate to a Governing Board meeting. This person would be someone other than the National Director or Alternate National Director. The previous policy required three days' notice.
- FMCA nameplates, which are affixed to coaches, will now be available without a member number at the request of some with confidentiality concerns. They may be ordered (at the member's expense) through the Kiley Mold Company.
- In the first nine months of the FMCAssist Program there were 43 separate occurrences higher than expected. However, the average claim of \$3,900 was lower than expected. Claims ranged from \$168 to \$21,000. FMCA is trying hard to keep the loss ratio in line so there will only be a modest premium increase. A strong reminder of the importance of notification to 7 Corners was stressed. When you have an emergency: (1) Call 911 (2) Call 7 Corners and (3) Call home. DO NOT send bills after the fact and expect reimbursement!
- Membership continues to decrease. An average of 1,000 new members are added monthly. However, we are losing 1,200 members per month. Luckily, FMCA's investments are doing great, and cover the FMCAssist costs without touching the principal.
- The Pomona convention had a final operating loss of \$66,016. Therefore, Pomona has been withdrawn from consideration for the winter 2017 Family Reunion. The alternate site of Chandler, AZ has been proposed, and negotiations are currently underway with the Wild Horse Pass Hotel and Casino.

We had a wonderful time, met so many people and had some great laughs. Both of us attended several seminars, and joined an FMCA tour visiting the beautiful state capitol, Monona Terrace, and the University of Wisconsin. Our personal favorite was the Wisconsin Veterans' Museum---not to be missed if you are ever in the area. The people of Madison were so welcoming!

The next Western Area Rally is January 6-10, 2016 in Indio at the Riverside County Fair & National Date Festival.

#### COWBOY COOKIES (Joan Edman)

4 cups flour
2 tsp. baking powder
2 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
2 cups shortening (I use butter)
2 cups brown sugar
2 cups white granulated sugar
4 cups rolled oats
4 eggs
2 cups nuts (I use walnuts)
2 tsp. vanilla
2 small packages of chocolate chips



Sift together dry ingredients. Blend together shortening and sugar, add eggs, and beat till fluffy. Add flour mixture and mix well. Add oats, chips, nuts and vanilla. Mix well and use an ice cream scoop to form them into balls. Since I like a big cookie, I put 4 rows of 3 cookies per large cookie sheet.

Bake at 350 degrees for 15 min. I bake at 325 degrees in my convection oven and for the same amount of time.

This dough freezes VERY well. I put the balls of dough in a Ziploc bag. When you want to bake them, take out of freezer 15 minutes or so before.

I usually halve this recipe. It makes close to 3 dozen cookies depending on size of your balls...©!!











































#### DISCOVERY CLUB OF CALIFORNIA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES
